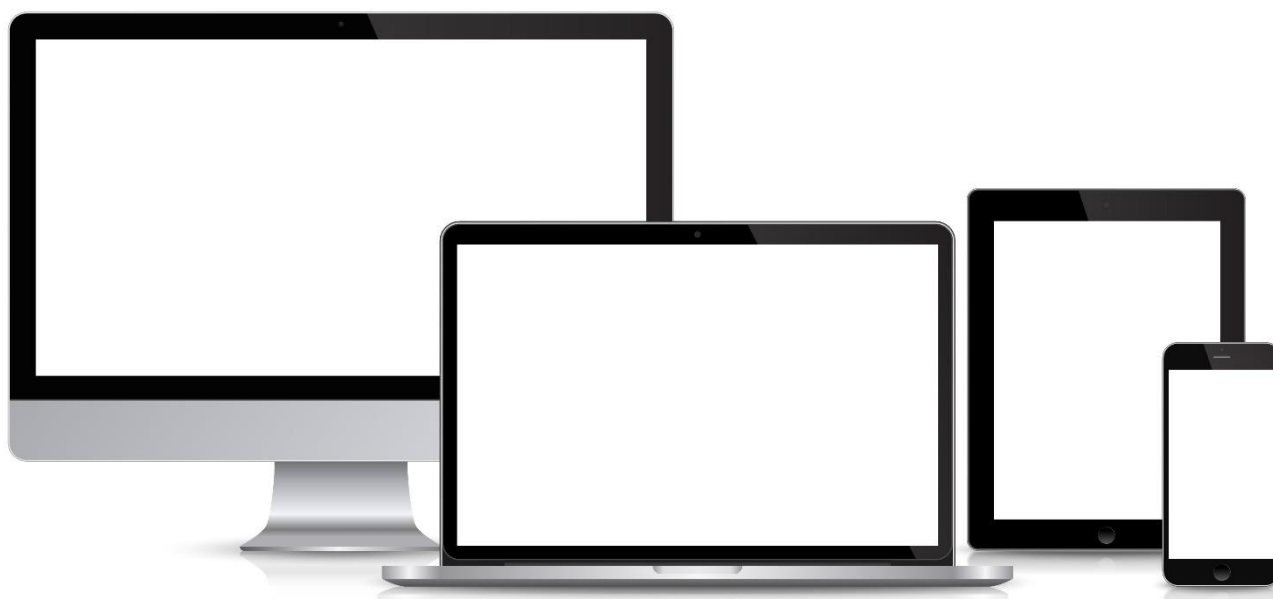

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INTRODUCTION

Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your support in this hugely challenging period for us all. We aim, through all of this, to be a constant for the children and we will endeavour to support our school communities as much as we possibly can.

We have never before been through anything like this and in the following booklet we aim to outline how we intend to navigate what is a quickly changing situation.

We guarantee that all our staff are giving their all through learning how to use technologies effectively and providing supportive pastoral provision.

This booklet includes details of the academic provision, guidelines for maintaining a sensible balance and routine to their daily lives during the period of closure and some useful links for pupils' wellbeing.

In terms of what you can do to help your children in the coming weeks with their studies, you don't need to be an expert in any subject to support your child at home but encouragement and awareness of what they are studying is invaluable.



SUPPORT

There are some small practical ways in which you can involve yourselves and support your children without having to watch over them all day long:

Take an interest in what your child is working on.

Be curious, ask them to teach you about something, ask questions, such as:

- Can you explain that to me?
- Can you give me some evidence for that?
- What do you mean when you say...?

Offer praise and encouragement. Acknowledging the hard work your child puts in is really important and can keep them going.

Children really value this from their parents – even if they don't tell you that!

Make sure your child has a good routine in place for completing work. It might help to have specific times for using technology, going outside, reading, and completing learning. Children are used to the routine of the school day so it's helpful to have this at home as well and ensure that those devices are put to bed well before the children.

Ensure your child has a suitable and comfortable space where they can work, free from distractions.

Ensure they have breaks, eat and drink healthily, read books, take exercise and enjoy some fresh air.

We will endeavour to focus our attention on the following:

- 1) We remain connected as a community at all times**
- 2) Our standards for education continue for all pupils**
- 3) Understanding that parents may continue to work, including those who are our teachers and support staff, and will be required to manage the logistics of supervising children either while at home or elsewhere.**



We will strive to support our children and families through these challenges, being flexible, tolerant and living the values of our schools.

LEARNING

While the School is 'closed' and online learning is happening, children are encouraged to work from home or where there is good internet access and in a safe location known and approved by their parent or carer. Children should be focused and supported in their learning.

Teachers will plan lessons and activities that relate as closely as possible (within reason) to the current class content or skills.

The activities will aim to reinforce existing understanding as planned for in the regular scheme of work for the year group.

We expect that the older a child is, the more independently they should be able to carry out the tasks set by teachers, including access to materials online. We **DO NOT** expect children to be maintaining the same number of school hours as normal, nor even the same structure of the school day.

Plan something that works for you and your child/children. Structure is good – children thrive on structure – but don't be too rigid. Be as flexible as works for you and your home context.

Lessons and activities will be posted across the week, from Monday to Friday. Lessons online will be shorter than traditional lessons in the classroom.

We will **NOT** show any live lessons or expect any live conferencing with children or parents. There will be resources, projects and/or activities available to the children and the teachers will use these platforms to check children's understanding.

If pupils wish to communicate via these methods, we would encourage this. We want the children to feel 'connected' to school and their teachers, even if not in the usual ways. Staff are desperate to have communication with the children and are happy to provide feedback.

All communication with teachers should be via the year group (yearx@kingsnorth.kent.sch.uk) email address or through SeeSaw – teachers will not provide personal numbers or email addresses to children or parents.

It must be noted, that as numbers in school begin to increase, the amount of online learning may decrease as we have to be mindful of the workload and commitments of our staff.

As always in school, children are expected to behave online as they would in the classroom: politely and sensibly.

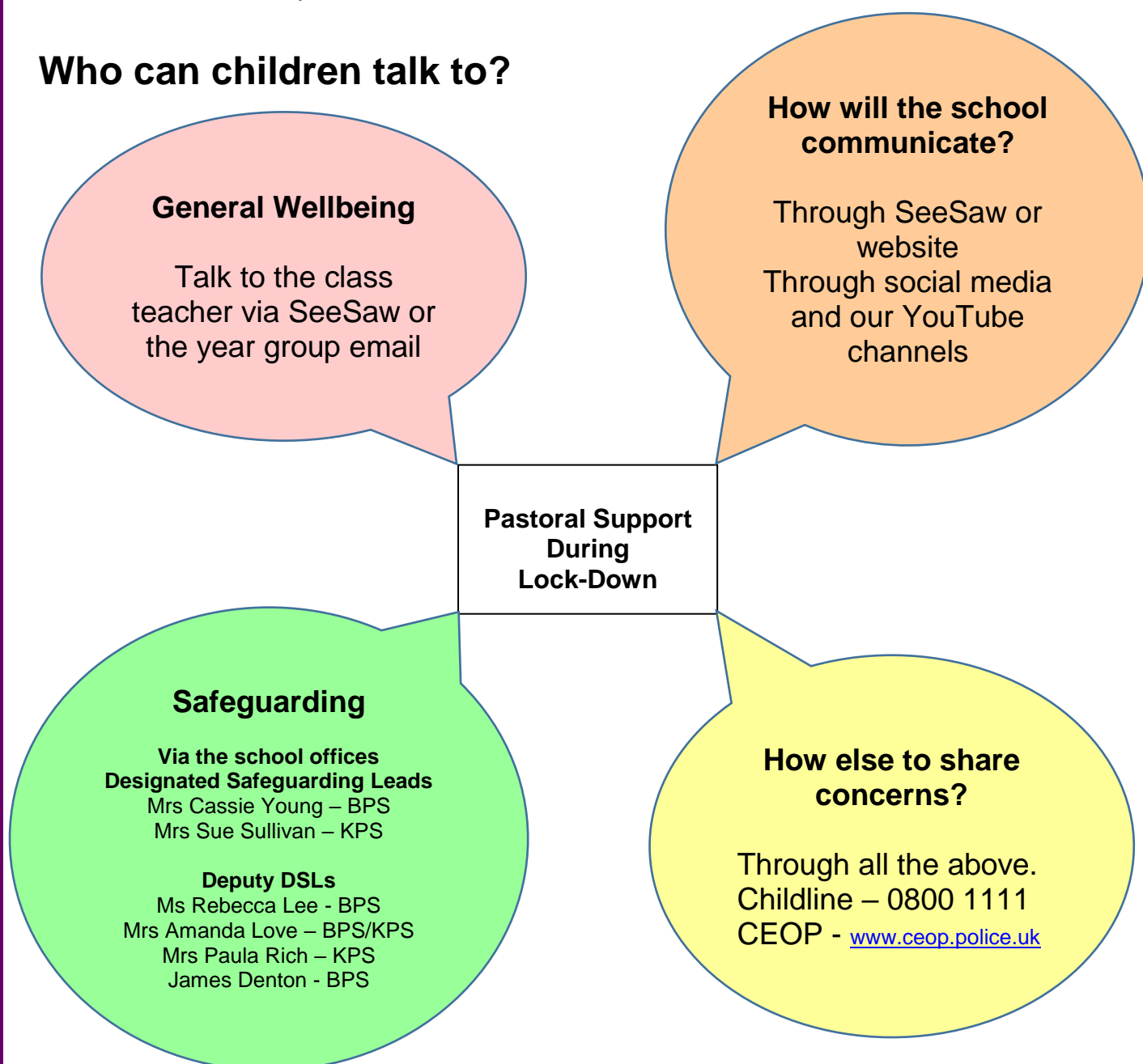
It is vital that all children respect their learning and the work their teachers are setting. Any feedback and communication with the teacher **MUST** be polite and courteous.

TECHNOLOGY

Technology underpins the online teaching and learning environment and is robust, secure and sustainable for the future. Our teachers have been trained in using these platforms over the past few years along with our pupils, who possess the digital literacy skills to use it confidently and in a competent manner.

All pupils will have access to their classes via Seesaw or the class pages on the school website. All posts within these platforms will be recorded and are stored in the back end of our systems. It is expected that online behaviour and language must mirror the usual high expectations of a classroom.



Our teachers will ensure that they are available during usual school times and provide feedback for pupils via a personalised approach, usually written or annotated feedback.

As and when life begins to return to 'normal' we will be looking to see how we can continue to use online learning to support our children's academic achievements.
