Brenzett Church of England Primary School Uniform Policy

All children are expected to wear the school colours of navy blue and grey. We politely ask and expect parents to support our school policy on school uniform. Most of our uniform can be purchased from the school uniform retailer of your choice, however the school jumper/cardigan, tie and PE top with the school logo can only be purchased from Brigade. All Brenzett Primary School uniform supplied by Brigade can be bought online.

Winter

- A navy blue v neck sweatshirt or cardigan which displays the school logo
- A white long or short sleeved shirt. Polo tops are **NOT** to be worn
- School tie- elasticated for KS1, standard for KS2
- Black smart school shoes must be an appropriate safe style without large heels (trainers are **not** to be worn)
- Grey trousers for boys and optional for girls no jogging bottoms, jeans or track suit bottoms
- Grey pinafore dress or skirt with white socks or grey/black tights
- Children must have appropriate outdoor wear that can protect them from both cold and damp weather conditions.

Summer

- Summer dress in blue and white check (girls only)
- It is encouraged to wear cycling shorts underneath summer dresses to protect our pupils' modesty when playing- these can be white, navy or black
- White socks with skirts or dresses
- Grey shorts
- White short sleeved shirt
- School tie (only if you are wearing a white shirt- a tie is not needed if wearing a summer dress)

PE Kit

- Navy shorts/joggers
- Red/Blue/Yellow/Green top (dependent on the house your child is in) with or without school logo
- Black plimsolls or black or white trainers may be worn but only for outdoor PE lessons- these must be different shoes to your child's school shoes

EYFS- indoor and outdoor wear

As part of the curriculum in the Foundation stage, children are encouraged to use the outdoor environment at all times to support free flow between the inside and outside learning environment. It is essential that all Reception pupils have appropriate outdoor coats and shoes suitable for the weather, i.e. wet weather coat and trousers, plus wellies.

Forest School

All pupils must have the following to be able to access outdoor learning. Your child's safety is of the utmost importance to us, so having the correct clothing is necessary for them to enjoy learning outside no matter what the weather, as safely as possible.

- Trousers- no jeans
- Waterproof trousers
- Long sleeve top
- Hoody or jumper (winter)
- Warm/lightweight waterproof jacket (dependent on time of year)
- Sun hat/Woolly hat
- Gloves and scarf (winter)
- Thick socks
- Spare underwear and socks
- Wellies

Branded Uniform

Uniform items with the embroidered school logo are purchased from Brigade at a reasonable cost. Brigade offers a vast selection of other optional items; full details can be found on their website. https://www.brigade.uk.com/

Jewellery

For the safety of all children, jewellery should not be worn at school. Parents are respectfully requested to support this requirement to prevent loss and/or injury.

Children with pierced ears are permitted to wear small stud earrings only. These must be removed before PE lessons or covered with micropore tape (to be provided by the parent) to prevent loss and/or injury.

Hairstyles and Presentation

We like our children to be of smart appearance. Unnaturally coloured hair or shaved heads or patterns shaved into the hair are not suitable for school as this can draw attention to a child in an unhelpful way. Long hair should be tied back for reasons of hygiene and safety. We also ask that bows and large hair bands are not worn in school and that any bands or clips are that of the school colours.

Naming Clothing and Property

Please ensure <u>ALL</u> clothing and property is clearly marked so that lost articles may be easily traced and returned to their owner. The school cannot accept responsibility for loss or damage of pupils' property and valuables.
